WHITNEY AND BRITNEY CHICKEN DIVAS

WRITTEN AND ILLUSTRATED BY LUCINDA GIFFORD

SYNOPSIS

Whitney and Britney are two gorgeous chooks who live with their friend Dora von Dooze the fox. To Dora's dismay, they spend their days snoozing and napping and are no company for her at all. The chooks, you see, have a secret. Every night they dress in fancy costumes and head to the theatre to perform in front of admiring crowds. How Dora investigates and discovers their secret lives is an entertainingly whimsical trip through a fantasy world where chooks wear feather boas and foxes are their best friends.

WRITING STYLE

Gifford utilises a scene-limited thirdperson omnipotent voice, so the revelation of Dora's abilities and secret life comes as a delightful surprise for both the reader and the Chicken Divas. Consisting entirely of verse, the language used is as dramatic as the chooks who star in this story, and is ideally suited to reading aloud. Plot tension is consistently maintained throughout, with revelations of exciting chicken behaviour and antics present in the last line of several verses, supported by a layout placing the final word or phrase over the page. Rollicking, flamboyant, and rich with exciting adjectives to excite the young and endear the characters to older readers, this is the perfect book to share for National Simultaneous Storytime.

ILLUSTRATION STYLE

Consisting of a mix of full and half page spreads, vignettes, and multi-panel

illustrations, Gifford's artwork is as colourful and bright as the characters. The characters are presented as anthropomorphised versions of the various animals, wearing (glittery) clothes, and with brightly coloured fur, feathers or scales. The visual narrative parallels the textual narrative throughout, and Gifford's deft use of texture and highlights illustrate the glitter, sparkle and shine that her words describe.

BEFORE READING

Before reading the story, look carefully at the cover and title. Ask: Who do you think Whitney and Britney might be? What is a diva? What do you think a Chicken Diva might be? Why do you think the chickens are such bright colours? Do you think Chicken Divas might behave differently to backyard chooks? How?

ACTIVITIES

Make a Chicken Diva headdress to wear for National Simultaneous Storytime.

Use a strip of thin card for the headband, and adorn it with brightly coloured feathers, scraps of colourful fabric or yarn, glitter, sequins and paint. Once your creation is dry, carefully staple the ends of the card together.

Design a Diva costume.

Draw a labelled illustration of your design and colour it using acrylic paints and glitter glue.

Listen to some jazz music.

Find something you think Foxy and the Chickettes might like to perform to.

Create a feather-patterned art design for Foxy and the Chickettes' poster advertising their next performance.

Make Chicken Diva handprint art.

Carefully paint the palm of one of your hands with non-toxic washable poster paint, and make a handprint on a clean piece of paper.

Once your handprint has dried, use a felttipped marker to draw a beady chicken eye and a beak on the thumb, a wobbly line for the wing on the palm of the hand, and draw lines on the fingers to form the chicken's feathers.

Don't forget to draw legs underneath as well!

Decorate your Chicken Diva with brightly coloured markers, paint, or glitter glue.

Make your own feather boa out of strips of crepe paper.

Cut a piece of A4 construction paper lengthwise into 6 strips.


Glue, tape or staple the strips together to form one long piece of paper to make the spine of your feather boa.

Cut crepe paper into strips approximately 2cm wide and 15cm long.

Glue or tape one end of each piece of crepe paper to the construction paper spine so the crepe paper strip is at right angles to the spine.

Continue gluing the crepe paper strips along the spine, alternating sides, until the entire spine is covered.







A BOWL FULL OF PEACE: A TRUE STORY

These notes are for use with students aged 5-10

WRITTEN BY CAREN STELSON ILLUSTRATED BY AKIRA KUSAKA

BEFORE READING

Consider the subtitle: 'A *True Story*'. How does this affect your predictions about this story? What do you expect from a story that's truth rather than fiction?

EXPLORING THE TEXT

After reading the book, why do you think the author chose to call the story A Bowl Full of Peace?

As a class, identify some of the main themes of the text (e.g. family, war, change, hope, tradition). What messages about these themes do you think the text is communicating?

A major theme in this story is hope. How do we see hope in Sachiko's story? Why is hope important in everyday life? What are some ways to find hope in sad or difficult times?

Before eating, Sachiko and her family bow their heads, press their hands together and say "itadakimasu," meaning "we humbly receive this food." Does your religion, culture or family have any special mealtime traditions that are important to you? What does this tradition mean to you?

Grandmother's bowl is a precious family heirloom. Does your family have any objects that have been handed down from family member to family member? What makes that object special?

How does Sachiko keep the memories of her family close to her? Why is this so important?

Discuss why Sachiko decides to share her story with the world. What messages and lessons does she have to impart?

Read the note from author Caren Stelson at the end of A Bowl Full of Peace, with the facts about the bombing of Nagasaki. How does it make you feel? How can we learn from the past?

EXPLORING THE ILLUSTRATIONS

Examine several of the spreads and have a class discussion about the following:

- What is the composition (i.e. where are the key elements placed)? Are the characters large or small? In the foreground or background? Do they seem powerful or weak; happy or sad; scared or confident, etc?
- What are the characters on this page doing and where are they looking?
 Why are they doing this? What effect does this have?
- Is the illustration framed or does it take up the whole page? Why do you think Akira Kusaka illustrated it this way?
- Do the colours change from spread to spread? Make a list of the colours used in each area (this is called the colour palette). Why do you think he chose these colour palettes?

In some of the spreads, people are not drawn in colour, and look as if like shadows. Why do you think the illustrator made this choice? How does it affect you as a reader?

Consider the spreads when the bomb is dropped. How are they different to the rest of the book? How did they make you feel?

FURTHER ACTIVITIES

What is the purpose of this text (tell a story, give information, persuade, etc.)? Does it have more than one purpose? How can you tell? Who is the intended audience for this book?

Sachiko goes through a range of emotions in the story. Look at each spread and discuss how she might be feeling, and how you can tell using clues from the text and illustrations.

Origami cranes are a symbol of peace. Help the class to make their own origami cranes.

Have you or anyone in your class been to Japan? Share your stories and experiences.

Write a journal entry/reflection after reading this book. Some questions to consider could be:

- What did you feel while reading the book? Which parts of the story made you feel most emotional?
- Do you know anyone who is like a character in this story?
- If you were telling this story, what would you change?
- If you could speak to the author or illustrator, what would you ask them?

THE SCHOOL LIBRARY AS A SPACE FOR GENDER EQUITY IN STEM LEARNING

VER HALF of all school libraries now incorporate maker spaces that have transformed information centres into innovation hubs. The best programs combine STEM learning and traditional library activities to offer access, innovation and community. Libraries typically hold a key position in schools, solving equity problems, ensuring every child has access to information and technology—and they are at the centre of the one space in a school that every child and teacher can use.

Equity doesn't just mean access across socio-economic strata. Gender gaps in STEM careers and interest in STEM subjects typically skews towards males by the time students reach high school. Expanding opportunities for girls is not just the right thing to do, investing in diversity is also a smart business opportunity. To meet demand, improve innovation, and ensure social equity, STEM professions need the imaginations and talents of girls as well as people from lower socio-economic groups and minority groups.

There is plenty of scope for making the pool of girls interested in STEM wider. Around 25% of girls say they are interested in a career in STEM, but many girls have a lack of exposure to STEM activities both in and out of school. This lack of interest-creating exposure has been identified as a key contributor to the comparatively low number of women entering the STEM workforce—presently only 16% of STEM graduates (Higher Education and VET) and only 27% of the STEM workforce are women. To address this, the National STEM School Education Strategy² has outlined five areas for national action to increase the number of girls in the STEM pipeline. These include:

- · Building a strong evidence base
- Increasing student STEM ability, engagement, participation and aspiration
- Increasing teacher capacity and STEM teaching quality



- Supporting STEM education opportunities within school systems
- Facilitating effective partnerships with tertiary education providers, business and industry.

Schools have an especially important role to play regarding the final point of this strategy. And often, it is the school library that plays host to programs, initiatives and partnerships designed to increase girls' (and also boys') exposure to STEM fields, subjects, activities and careers.

One industry partnership with primary schools making headways in this area, is the Bright Future STEM Program.

Coordinated by the Australian Resources and Energy Group, AMMA, this national program promotes STEM as a fun and interactive experience and career path. It highlights the role of STEM in the resources and energy industry through interactive activities while also providing female role models to break down gender stereotypes.

The program reached over 3,000 students in 2019 with significant national expansion in 2020. Feedback on the program has indicated positive engagement by schools, students and industry STEM professionals. Teachers report an ignition of excitement by students and a genuine commitment to continuing to talk about STEM with their students to continue the momentum created by the program.



Kylie Adams, Teacher/Librarian at Wyong Primary School in NSW, runs one of the most innovative Library/
STEM spaces we've seen, bringing daily STEM experiences to children who may otherwise miss access and opportunity. Kylie is acutely aware of the data around the disparity between male and female students enrolling in engineering subjects at university and the research that shows how boys often take over STEM tasks in the classroom.

Kylie writes: #girlscancode is a hashtag I use sometimes on my Instagram page because I want to remind all of the girls in our school and wider community that there is a place for girls in STEM. I like to highlight how girls have solved coding obstacles and problem solved solutions. When we have conversations about what their careers will look like, I try to say 'have you thought about ... because you are a great programmer. Or you have great ideas, maybe you could be a designer? I also like to link books to STEM experiences. That way, if someone is not sure of their role within the group, they can flick through the books for inspiration. I see this as feeding into the collaborative experience many
