ABOUT THE BOOK

Somebody's Land is an invitation to connect with First Nations culture, to acknowledge the hurt of the past, and to join together as one community with a precious shared history as old as time.

Adam Goodes and Ellie Laing's powerful words and David Hardy's pictures, full of life, invite children and their families to imagine themselves into Australia's past – to feel the richness of our First Nations' history, to acknowledge that our country was never terra nullius, and to understand what 'welcome to our country' really means.

BEFORE READING

It is important to first consider any Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children reading this book and how the perspectives and themes could impact them. The significant impacts of past and current policies influence Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children's journey and their knowledge and experiences differ with every child. It is also important to consider the experiences of any person reading this book, who could be impacted by the removal from their homelands, family, kinship and country. It is strongly recommended that before work on Somebody's Land begins teachers and librarians read ACARA'S Guiding principles for promoting and implementing the Australian Curriculum cross-curriculum priority.

Building Field Knowledge: Find out what your students already know about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and cultures by asking questions such as:

- Who were the first peoples to live on the land we now call Australia?
- What do you know about how Aboriginal people lived? [Encourage a broad discussion, including music, art, food, history, language, culture.] Please note that it is important to stress to students that Aboriginal culture is a living culture. Some Aboriginal people today continue to live as their ancestors did because their culture has passed from generation to generation over thousands of years.
- Do you know what an Acknowledgement of Country is and why it is important?
- Do you know what a Welcome to Country is and why it is important?

Show your class the Somebody's Land front cover and ask students to respond to it by asking:

- What animals can see on the cover? [Goanna, Koala, Brolga]
- What do these animals have in
- common? [Native to Australia]Where do you think this book will
- where do you think this book v be set? [Australia]

- Do you think these people might be Aboriginal? What makes you think that?
- Do you think they might be a family? What makes you think that?

Corner

- What do you think the mum and dad are doing for their family?
- What do you think the baby is thinking while looking at the 'big boys'?
- Do they look happy? Why do you think that?
- The book's title is Somebody's Land. Who do you think the Somebody in the title might be?

CURRICULUM LINKS

Heroes of Black Summer is suitable for use in primary schools and would link to a range of areas across the curriculum. It offers opportunities to discover Australian country towns in cross-curricular units. Students can learn to compare and investigate the environments, habitats and climate relating to flora and fauna across Australia, develop an understanding of natural disasters and determine ways to reduce, mitigate or prepare for natural disasters.

Themes include: bushfire, hope, community, loss, wildlife rescue, courage.

BEFORE READING

Show the front cover to the class reading out the title (*Heroes of Black Summer*) and ask the following questions:

- What is a hero?
- Can you think of any heroes that you have read or heard about before?
- What makes them a hero?Do these people on the cover look like heroes?
- Why do you think they are called heroes?

DURING READING

Vocabulary: After an initial reading of the book go through each page and highlight some of the specific words used in the text. Words of interest may include 'scorching,' endangered', 'stranded', 'scheme', 'orchard', 'debris', 'extinction', and 'precious'.

Visual literacy: Working with the illustrations, ask students why they think

the illustrator chose particular images or colours to tell the story, or what feelings this imagery might evoke in them.

General comprehension questions:

- Why was Dale's decision brave? Who else was being brave during the bush fires?
- Why do you think the man donated the extra money when he bought his water bottle?
- What could you do to help support someone in need?
- Why would clearing the ash and debris near the walking trails be important?
- Why was it important to protect and recover native animals?
- What do you think they meant by "you don't need a cape to be a superhero"?

AFTER READING

Subject-specific activities:

English

After reading the text, discuss again with the class what a hero is and what makes a person a hero. Use this statement as a writing stimulus: "_____ is a hero." Students can brainstorm some of the heroes they have encountered and choose one to write about. What made them a hero and why? You could also use this as a persuasive writing task to persuade your audience to consider someone a hero. (ACELY1682, ACELY1694, ACELY1704)

Maths

Using local towns from the story, students can calculate a range of distances to incorporate length, distance and time into their lessons. Students could calculate the distance that the



Humanities & Social Sciences

Students develop their skills using an Atlas or a map to locate specific towns from the book. They can create a fact file outlining things that the town is famous for and create a poster/presentation sharing this information. Things such as town population, climate, environment, interesting facts etc. could all be areas of focus in the fact file. (ACHASSK069, ACHASSK068)

Visual Arts

Students could create a stopmotion video depicting the changes in the environment. They could create a musical composition to be recorded over the top, reflecting the sound of bushfires. This could then be used in a weather report or natural disasters information report as a multimedia activity. (ACAMAM064)

Science and Technology

Students can predict the effect when living things die out or are removed from a local area and how that can impact the rest of the environment around them. Students can then look into how the environment adapts to natural disasters (e.g. eucalyptus trees are protected by their thick bark and often store their buds in the ground. This way after a fire, they can stipulate their flowers to regrow). (ACSSU094, ACSSU043)
