# How To Make Your Paper Plate Cow Mask You will need:

- 1 paper plate for each student
- White and brown craft paint and paintbrushes for your students
- Enough scissors for the class to share
- Brown, pink and yellow felt
- Craft glue
- Thick black marker
- A length of hat elastic for each student, as long as the diameter of the paper plate
- A stapler



## Step 1

Draw eye holes on your paper plate, just above centre. Pinch plate together to cut out—you will probably have to do this for younger children.




#### Step 2

Mix together white paint with a touch of brown and yellow to make a light beige colour like the cow in the book, and paint all over your paper plate. You may need two coats to get solid coverage.


Once the light-coloured paint is dry, paint some dark brown splotches to match the cow in the book, or get creative and decorate your own beautiful cow face!






## Step 6

Tie a knot in each end of the hat elastic and staple the ends to the sides of the back of the mask, with the knots on the outside to stop the elastic slipping through the staples.
